Teaching Spanish in **Barcelona since 2015**

Whether you are here to work, study, raise a family or simply experience life in the city, speaking Spanish opens more doors, brings you closer to people and makes Barcelona feel more like your own.

We taught our first Spanish class in 2015. What began as a few occasional groups of learners has grown, over more than ten years, into an independent school with its own team of teachers and coordinators, working from six classrooms on Carrer d'Aragó, just a few minutes from the Sagrada Família.

Iberia Language Academy is a Spanish school for adults and children. Our students live in Barcelona or come to the city for a while, for work, for study, or for a project of their own. We help them build the Spanish they need to take part in the life they are actually living here.

Our courses follow the Common European Framework of Reference and the Instituto Cervantes curricular plan. Groups have no more than twelve students, and our cultural programme takes learning beyond the classroom and into the city.

We look forward to welcoming you to the school.

How we help students **make progress**

Groups of twelve, maximum

Every class is capped at twelve students, so the teacher has time for each person and can follow individual progress closely.

Qualified, experienced teachers

Our teachers hold a university degree, specialist training in teaching Spanish as a foreign language, and classroom experience. Teaching is coordinated and reviewed by the academic direction.

A communicative approach

Classes are built around real tasks and authentic contexts, so you spend the lesson using Spanish rather than listening to explanations about it.

Culture as part of the course

Workshops, city routes and excursions are part of the programme, not an extra. They are where the Spanish you study gets used.

Morning, afternoon and evening

Classes run from 09:30 to 20:00, so the course can fit around work or study.

A record that follows you

Your attendance, results and progress reports are kept in the school portal, so any member of the team can pick up where the last one left off.



Who studies here

Our students come from very different places, ages and starting points, and that mix is a feature of the school rather than an accident of it.

Where they come from. Most are from western and central Europe, Germany, France, Italy, the United Kingdom and the Netherlands. A significant group comes from North America, chiefly the United States and Canada, usually on intensive courses and shorter stays. In recent years we have also welcomed a growing number of students from the Middle East.

How old they are. Our regular courses are mostly young adults between twenty-two and thirty, many of them at university or recently graduated. Alongside them are professionals between thirty and fifty studying for work or international mobility, and a smaller group over fifty who link learning to cultural interest and settling into the city.

What languages they bring. The most common first languages are English, German, French and Italian, joined by Arabic and Slavic languages. Teachers plan around the difficulties each of these tends to produce.

Why they study. Some need working Spanish for a job or a degree; some want to take part in the life of the city; some are preparing for an official certificate; and some need to prove a level for residency or nationality.

Across the year. During the academic year our students are mainly international residents in Barcelona taking continuing courses. In summer the profile widens with shorter stays and groups from study-abroad programmes.



The team

Every teacher holds a university degree and a specialist postgraduate qualification in teaching Spanish as a foreign language. Teaching is coordinated by the academic direction, which runs internal training, observes classes and moderates assessment.

The school

We are at Carrer d'Aragó 403-405, in the Eixample, a few minutes' walk from the Sagrada Família and close to Metro Sagrada Família and Monumental.

The school has six classrooms, equipped for audiovisual work and arranged for group teaching rather than rows of desks. Alongside them there is a library, a common area for breaks, a teachers' room, and secure wireless internet throughout the building.

The library

Open to all students during reception hours, free of charge, for reading in the library or borrowing. The collection holds graded readers, grammars, exam preparation material and books on Hispanic culture. Loans are recorded in the school portal.



Access and support. Students report any problem with a room or equipment through the school portal, where reception picks it up and passes it on. Students who need adjustments for a disability or a specific learning need can tell us on the enrolment form or at any point during the course.



Spanish courses at **Iberia Language Academy**

All our Spanish courses share the same design. They run to a published programme with stated objectives and assessment criteria, they are referenced to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages, and they are taught in groups of no more than twelve.

Group size

Twelve students maximum in every class.

Lesson length

One teaching hour is 55 minutes. Course hours below are teaching hours.

Levels

Seventeen modules from A1.1 to C1.2+, referenced to the CEFR.

Placement

A free placement test before you enrol. It sits outside the course and does not use up contracted hours.

What every course aims at

Our programmes follow the three learner profiles set out in the Instituto Cervantes curricular plan, so each course works towards all three:

The social agent. Carrying out real tasks in Spanish with other people, in the situations of daily and working life.

The autonomous learner. Taking charge of your own learning, with the assessment criteria, progress reports and learning diary that make that possible.

The intercultural speaker. Reading and moving between cultures, starting from Barcelona and Spain and opening out to the wider Spanish-speaking world.

Assessment and **certificates**

Each module has its own programme, objectives and assessment criteria, and your teacher goes through them with the group in the first sessions. Modules end with an assessment covering listening, reading, writing, speaking, and grammar and vocabulary, alongside continuous assessment of your work in class.

You can ask for a **certificate of attendance** at any time; it states the hours you actually attended. A **certificate of achievement**, which states the module completed, your marks by area and your attendance, requires three things: at least 80 % attendance, sitting the complete final assessment, and a final mark of 60 % or more.

Every certificate is recorded in the school portal with its own number, so a copy can be issued again at any time.

What you get at the start

- The programme for your module and its objectives
- The assessment criteria and the marking scale
- Access to the school portal, where your timetable, attendance, results and progress reports live
- A learning diary to record what you are working on

How we follow your progress

Tutorials during the course, a written progress report from your teacher, and a record in the portal you can see at any time. If something is not going well, we would rather tell you early than at the end.



Levels and **how long they take**

Your level is referenced to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). We divide each band into modules, so you move forward in steps that are short enough to see. Each column is one module; the figure is the number of weeks it normally takes at that intensity.

Modules run to 40 teaching hours up to B1.2+, 60 hours across B2 and 80 hours across C1. A teaching hour is 55 minutes.

Finding your level

Before you enrol we ask you to take our free online placement test, and we follow it with a short conversation. The test takes place before the course starts and does not count against your contracted hours. Complete beginners start at A1.1 and take no test.

Moving up

At the end of each module we assess your work and confirm the next step with you. If a module needs repeating, we say so and explain why. Progress is recorded in the school portal, where you can see your attendance and results.



Course fees

There is **no enrolment fee**. Prices are per course and include tuition, the use of course books in class, tutorials, assessment and the issue of your certificate. All prices are in euros and include any applicable taxes.

Enrolling, paying and **cancelling**

How to enrol

Take the free placement test, choose your course and dates, and complete the enrolment form on our website. You accept our general terms and conditions of contracting when you enrol; they are published in full at iberialanguageacademy.com/apply/terms. Before your course begins we send you confirmation of your enrolment, the amount paid and anything outstanding, our address and telephone number, an emergency contact, and what happens on your first day.

Telling us what you need

The enrolment form asks, in confidence, about any health condition, allergy, disability or other circumstance that could affect your full participation. You can tell us at enrolment or at any time during the course.

Paying

The course fee is paid in full when you book. We do not offer instalments, periodic payments or booking with an initial payment.

We accept card payment at the school, an online payment link, bank transfer and cash. Invoices are issued for every payment.

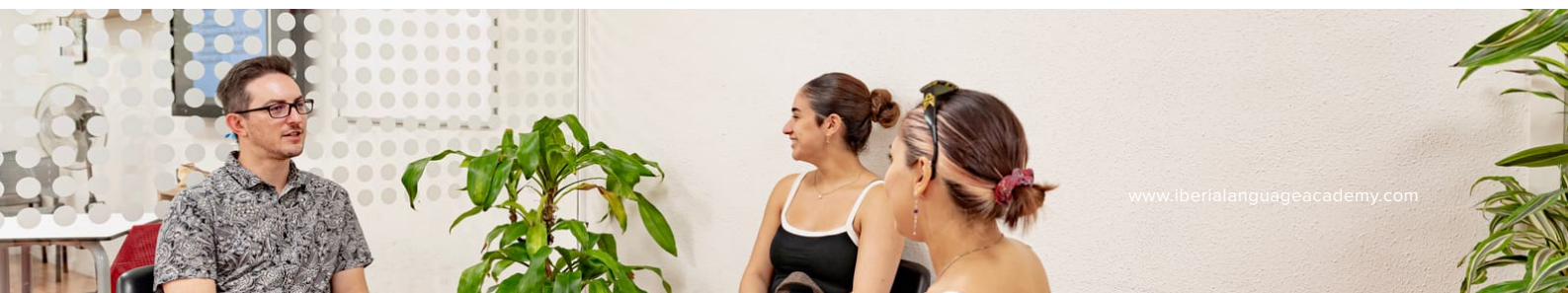
If you cancel before the course starts

Between 30 and 8 days before the start date	25 % of the course fee

Once the course has started	No refund, except where required by law or in cases of force majeure

The rest is refunded to you, by the same means you used to pay, within thirty days of us accepting the cancellation. Cancellations must be sent to us in writing by email.

Your right to withdraw. These conditions apply without prejudice to the fourteen-day right of withdrawal established under Spanish consumer law. If, at your express request, the course begins within that period, we may charge for the teaching already delivered, in proportion to the total fee.

If we cancel. If we cancel a course for any reason attributable to the school, you are entitled to a full refund of everything paid, with no deductions. We tell you as early as we can.



Cultural activities

Our focus is integration and the 'real' Barcelona, less sangría and more castanyada. The programme runs across the whole year, gives priority to Catalan and Spanish culture, and takes in the wider Spanish-speaking world. There are four kinds of activity.

Every month, in class. Included

A cultural workshop with your whole group, in class time, so there is nothing to book and nothing to pay. Catalan festive traditions in January, Carnival in February, Semana Santa in March, Sant Jordi and Cervantes in April, and so on through the year, pitched at your group's level.

Activities at the school

Outside class time, run by our own teachers, two hours each, all levels: a wine tasting, a tapas workshop, a merienda workshop and a Business Spanish workshop. Many are free; where there is a cost it covers the food, the drink or the ticket, and you see it before you sign up.

Guided tours and challenges

A guided tour of somewhere in the city with challenges to complete along the way, led by a teacher with our own materials: the streets around the school, Barcino and the Gothic quarter, a market, the MNAC, the Sagrada Família, Modernisme on Passeig de Gràcia and medieval Barcelona.

The language exchange. Free, every term

In the school library, 18:00 to 20:00, with something to eat. Open to all our Spanish students and to the English students of our sister school, TEFL Iberia, so the practice runs both ways.

Excursions and days out

Whole days out to the Costa Brava, the Pyrenees and towns nearby: Girona, Cadaqués, Montserrat, Mont Rebei. Others are an afternoon or an evening in the city, such as the Palau de la Música or a flamenco show. Booked with outside providers, who guide them, and priced separately.

Every activity is announced in class, in the school portal and on the noticeboards. You sign up through the portal, which manages the places and, when the activity needs it, the payment; you can also sign up at reception. Taking part is always voluntary.



Where you can stay

Accommodation is optional and for students aged 18 and over, booked on the same form as your course. Every home in our network is visited before we offer it, and our accommodation coordinator handles the whole process from booking to departure.



A room in a shared flat 750 € / 4 weeks

We run two flats of our own, with ten rooms between them, and rent the rooms to our students. You share with other ILA students, ex-students or locals. Best for stays of four weeks or more. Around **20 to 30 minutes** from the school by public transport.



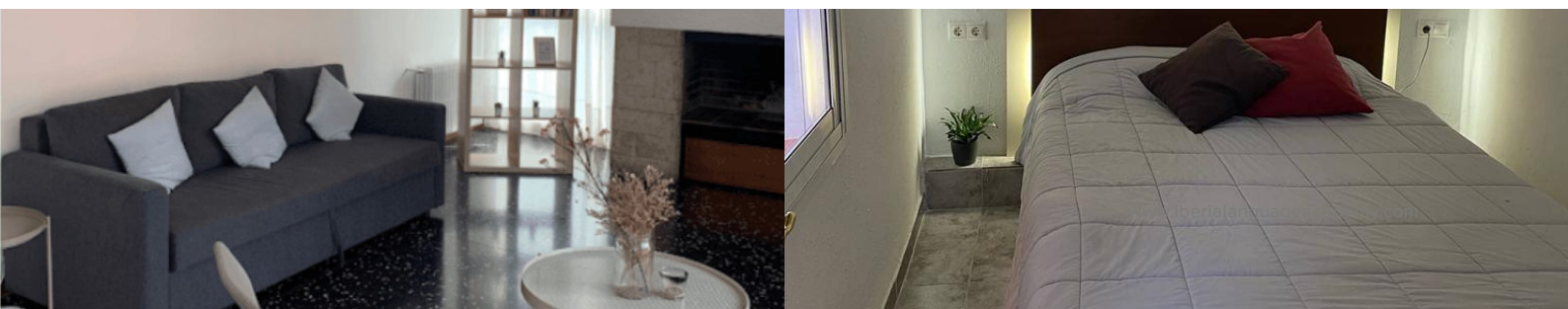
A room with a host 900 € / 4 weeks

You live in the home of a host who lives there too and shares the common areas with you. It gives you the most Spanish every day. Never more than three students per home. Best for stays of two to three weeks. **Under 40 minutes** from the school by public transport.

What to know before booking

Prices	Priced in four-week blocks, bills included. Longer stays are priced by the block. Tax included.
Your room	A private single bedroom with a desk and chair, storage, and heating or air conditioning. Bedding and towels ready on arrival.
Included	Kitchen, bathroom and living room, wifi throughout, and water, electricity, gas and internet for normal use. Shared areas in our flats are cleaned twice a month.
Not included	Food and meals, and public transport. Airport pick-up is an optional extra at 70 €.
Security deposit	200 €, returned after departure provided there is no damage.
Cancellation	Full refund more than four weeks before arrival; 50 % within four weeks; no refund within two weeks.
Minimum age	18, in both flats and with hosts.

Before you arrive we send a short questionnaire, so we can match you with compatible flatmates or a compatible host.
